The Bank of Princeton branch in New Brunswick, New Jersey was a fit-out of an existing unoccupied storefront space. The project scope included selective demolition, installation of a raised floor, an exterior ATM, teller stations fabricated with high-security glazing, offices, toilet rooms and an employee kitchenette. The work included security systems, carpentry, drywall, acoustic ceilings with custom lexan panels, flooring, wall finishes, specialties, window treatments, lighting, and new MEP systems, including extension of the building's fire protection systems. All work was completed in accordance with the Bank of Princeton's construction standards



The Bank of Princeton Montgomery project was a complete renovation of an existing branch. All work was completed while the bank remained in full operation. In order to accomplish this, we worked with the architect to implement a detailed phasing plan, which was developed to ensure minimal disturbance to the bank customers and employees.

The project scope included installation of a new exterior ATM location, all millwork and glazing materials necessary to create a new teller line, upgrades to the mechanical and fire alarm systems, new lighting, acoustical ceilings, signage and finishes.
